Hosted by the National Disaster and Emergency Management University (NDEMU) and FEMA Region 10 this three-day course is intended to assist jurisdictions who desire to develop or improve their Emergency Operations Centers (EOCs). Upon completion of this course, students will be able to demonstrate through activities and a final exam, the managerial and operational roles of the modern-day EOC as a National Incident Management System (NIMS) Command and Coordination functional group operating within a Multiagency Coordination System (MACS).

Target Audience:

Federal, state, tribal, territorial, local level, business and nongovernmental emergency management personnel who may be designated to support an EOC within their jurisdiction or organization.

Prerequisites:

Required prerequisites include Independent Study (IS) courses <u>IS-100</u>, <u>IS-700</u>, <u>IS-800</u>, and <u>IS-2200</u>. Recommended prerequisites include E/L/G-191 and IS-200.
